One topical issue is the imminent rehabilitation of the Bulbul landfill site located in Chatsworth Kwazulu-Natal. It must be remembered that landfills are but a component of the entire waste management process. Every single landfill site has a beginning and end, something pre-determined by law and the environmental custodians of the world. The final closure commences on 15 November after which the first phase of ‘capping’ commences. This will require the ongoing supply of clay and other technical materials required to fulfill the process over a five-year period.

The predictability of life, in any cycle, is that it always has a beginning and end. Some are longer than others, but the final result is the same. We all learn from the experience, adopt the positives and seek to benefit from relationships forged over time. Wasteman has spent 33 proud years as a member of the Chatsworth community, contributing to the growth and development of many aspects of the infrastructure. We look forward to embracing our community partners in this vital process of rehabilitation of one of their important pieces of real estate.

Government Legislation

A stringent legal process has to be implemented and followed to the letter by Wasteman, and will be monitored according to a prescribed legal framework. Due process is already well under way and the relevant authorities are involved throughout.

Land Rehabilitation

Land rehabilitation is the process of returning the land in a given area to some degree of its former state, after some process has resulted in its damage.

While it is rarely possible to restore the land to its original condition, the rehabilitation process usually attempts to bring some degree of restoration. Modern methods have in many cases not only restored degraded land but also actually improved it.

Looking after our staff

Wasteman will be continuing to implement our Integrated Waste Management Plans for our clients by implementing a strategic conversion plan to review the current waste streams accepted at Bulbul and to relocate them to either alternative locations, or by implementing our technologically advanced Waste Minimisation strategy to reduce the waste transportation requirements and dispose of the waste streams using alternative processes.

The majority of full time personnel will be re-deployed, re-trained and allocated to be part of this new process as well as to form the

team that undertakes the initial 5-year rehabilitation process on site.

Wasteman is geared and prepared for the dynamic changes and advances required to fulfill the mandatory requirements. Simultaneously, strategic advances will take place throughout the country as Wasteman integrates new technology and global Best Practices as part of our mission to enhance service delivery.

Looking after our customers

Hazardous waste from many current clients will now undergo re-evaluation and re-allocation to accommodate the closure and legislated rehabilitation of Bulbul. Each client's specific solution will be customized to provide a new, and in many cases, more efficient solution, involving the elimination or minimisation of adverse environmental effects from wastes in general, and landfills in particular. This will minimize the need for

waste disposal and simultaneously provide our clients with peace of mind about the professional management of their waste.

The underlying philosophy of best practice environmental management is continual improvement. To this extent Wasteman will either look to relocating waste to other appropriate landfill sites, such as Kwadukuza, which Wasteman also manages, or to implement waste minimization strategies to ensure a high level of protection for the environment in keeping with community expectations.



Integrated Waste Management

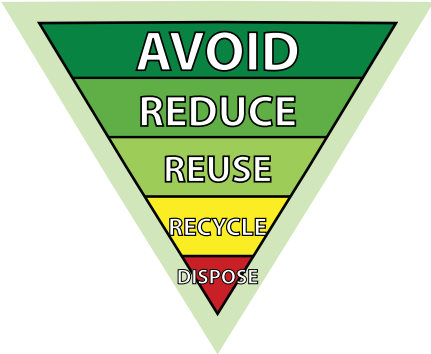
